HOW TO SHARE YOUR FAITH

This month's article is something I have not written about <u>ever</u> in the monthly newsletter; so, it's about time! Statistics over the years are pretty consistent: less than 10% of Christians share their faith – tell others about Jesus and his personal work in their lives. I have read in a number of places that there are around 500 verses in the Bible about evangelism. I have not taken the time to find all of them, but I can quickly find twenty-five or more verses that are about faith sharing. The most commonly quoted verse related to evangelism is the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20). Ironically, this verse is more about making disciples than a direct reference to evangelism. One of the shortest and clearly specific verses related to sharing our faith is I Peter 3:15. "But in your heart set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give the reason for the hope you have but <u>do this with gentleness and respect</u>." There are multiple layers to sharing our faith; I call it Sharing Your Faith 101.

First, and perhaps most important, realize that there are two aspects to faith sharing. The first aspect is mentioned in the first part of I Peter 3:15, "In your heart set apart Christ as Lord." Make sure your relationship with Christ is where it needs to be – live a godly life! There is no bigger barrier to faith sharing than to live a hypocritical Christian life. Actions speak louder than words! Show those close to you what Jesus would live like if he were walking on this earth today. The second aspect of faith sharing is what I call "the verbal aspect". I have never met a person who became a Christian without hearing about Jesus and how to make Him their savior. Many times I have heard people say, "I am not one who really speaks about my faith; I just live a Christian life and let my actions do my talking." Not only is this NOT biblical, it also is faulty thinking. Romans 10:14 says that people need to hear about the Lord in order to be saved.

There are several reasons people don't share their faith and perhaps the most common reason is they do not know what to say. Let me share the "How To" of sharing your faith. Nothing is more genuine than simply telling someone how and why you came to be a Christian. The formal way of saying this is, "Share your personal testimony." Testimonies are great because they are personal, usually practical, and hard to be argued against! Really, rarely will people get in an argument with you when sharing your faith.

Beyond your personal testimony, you can use the following tools... 1.) One Verse Evangelism. Use Romans 6:23 contrasting the wages of sin (death) to the gift of God (eternal life). 2.) The Roman Road – share in this order: Romans 3:23, 6:23, 10:9-10. 3.) The Four Spiritual Laws – God loves you and has a wonderful plan for your life (John 3:16), we are all sinners (Romans 3:23) and our sins separate us from God (Romans 6:23), Jesus paid the penalty for our sins (Romans 5:8), and we must individually receive Christ as our savior (John 14:6). My personal choice in sharing my faith is to share maybe 3 to 4 minutes of personal story, then start sharing scripture. The most important thing is to listen to both the Holy Spirit and the one you are sharing with. When you finish, ask them if they are ready to receive Christ.
